Precious is the Child



Part 1: Precious is the Child, because he is our ETERNAL gift

Pastor:

Tonight we celebrate the birth of the most precious Child of all, Jesus Christ. We shall look at five of the many, many reasons he is such a special gift from God. We hold him to be precious because he is eternal. Jesus is the eternal Son of God. And hundreds of years before his birth, the Old Testament prophets foretold his coming. As soon as Adam and Eve fell into sin, and by their sin death entered into the world, God gave them a promise of a savior who would be the eternal Son of God but also a true human being just like us who would undo what Satan had done:

<u>Congregation:</u> Genesis 3:15 "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."

Pastor:

After the flood, God through Noah prophesied that through the descendants of Shem, salvation for the world would come. Genesis 9:26-27 ²⁶He also said, "Praise be to the LORD, the God of Shem! May Canaan be the slave of Shem. ²⁷May God extend Japheth's territory; may Japheth live in the tents of Shem, and may Canaan be the slave of Japheth."

Later still, God chose a specific descendant of Shem, Abraham, whose

descendant one day would be the savior of all the world. Now the Lord said to Abram,

<u>Congregation:</u> Genesis 12:2-3 ² "I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.³ I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and all peoples on earth will be blessed through you."

Camille Bauer Narrator: Over time, the Lord gave through his prophets specific details of his coming. He would be of the tribe of Judah: The scepter will not depart from Judah, nor the ruler's staff from between his feet, until the one to whom it belongs comes. He will receive the obedience of the peoples. He would be of the family of David:

Congregation:

Micah 5:2 "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel, whose origins are from of old, from ancient times."

Isaiah 7:14 Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign: The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and will call him Immanuel.

Camille Bauer *Narrator*: But most important, the prophets told us what he would do for the world:

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light. For those living in the I and of the shadow of death, the light has dawned.

Isaiah 9:6 For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace.

Narrator and Congregation: Precious is the Child, because he is our eternal gift.

PASTOR AND CONGREGATION HYMN: 35 OF THE FATHER'S LOVE BEGOTTEN

Pastor Stanza 1. Of the Father's love begotten the worlds began to be,
He is Alpha and Omega,
He the source, the ending he,

Part 2: Precious is the Child, because he is our SAVING gift.

Emma Niebuhr *Narrator:* After generations of waiting and watching, God's people saw his promise fulfilled. Jesus came into our world at the right time, just as God had promised. Before Jesus was born, God sent an angel to his mother, Mary. The angel told Mary that she would have the special privilege of being the mother of the Savior. Listen as the angel tells Mary this miraculous news in Luke chapter 1.²⁶ In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, ²⁷ to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary.

Congregation: ²⁸ The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

Emma Niebuhr *Narrator*: ²⁹ Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be.

Congregation: 30 But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. 31 You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. 32 He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, 33 and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

Emma Niebuhr Narrator: 34 "How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

Congregation: ³⁵ The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God.

Emma Niebuhr *Narrator*: ³⁸ "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her. (Luke 1:26-35,38)

SEXTET: MARY DID YOU KNOW Accompanist: Brenda Scherer

Tanner Rieke *Narrator*: God also sent an angel to prepare Joseph, Mary's fiancé, for the birth of Jesus. ¹⁸ This is how the birth of Jesus the Messiah came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be pregnant through the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Because Joseph her husband was faithful to the law, and yet did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But after he had considered this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary home as your wife, because what is conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: ²³ "The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us").

When Joseph woke up, he did what the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took Mary home as his wife. ²⁵ But he did not consummate their marriage until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus. (Matthew 1:18-25)

Narrator and Congregation: Precious is the Child, because he is our saving gift.

Congregation Hymn 47 Behold a Branch is Growing

- 1 Behold, a Branch is growing
 Of loveliest form and grace,
 As prophets sang, foreknowing;
 It springs from Jesse's race
 And bears one little flow'r
 In midst of coldest winter,
 At deepest midnight hour.

Part 3: Precious is the Child, because he is our UNDESERVED gift

While the children are saying the recitations, the organ will softly introduce each hymn.

Maverick Johnson *Narrator*: When we exchange gifts at Christmas, we are reminded of the greatest gift of all, Jesus. Because we all sin, we have deserved God's wrath and punishment. But Jesus came to sacrifice his sinless life on the cross and suffer in our place.

<u>Children:</u> As Jesus himself says, "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life." John 3:16

Maverick Johnson *Narrator*: We call this the Gospel, that is, the Good News of God's undeserved love. Please join us in hearing the good news in Luke, Chapter 2 and singing it as well:

<u>Children:</u> In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. ² (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) ³ And everyone went to their own town to register.

⁴ So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. ⁵ He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. 6 While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, 1 and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no quest room available for them.

⁸ And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. 9 An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. ¹⁰ But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. ¹¹ Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. ¹² This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

¹⁵ When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about."

¹⁶ So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. ¹⁷ When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them.

Part 4: Precious is the Child, because he is our gift of JOY

Priscilla Bauer *Narrator*: We live in a world filled with heartaches, tears, tragedies, sickness and death. Yet, we can be happy and joyful, because we know about God's love in Jesus Christ. The Lord promises that he will use everything, even life's hardships, for our good.

The psalmist described the joy that awaits us in heaven, "You will fill me with joy in your presence, with eternal pleasures at your right hand" (Psalm 16:11).

We hear now of the joy that was brought to Anna and Simeon when they saw the Baby Jesus in the temple:

- Mary Niebuhr *Narrator*: ²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷ Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, ²⁸ Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying:
- Priscilla Bauer *Narrator*:

 Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace.

 For my eyes have seen your salvation, ³¹which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: ³² a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel."

 The child's father and mother marveled at what was said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, his mother: "This child is destined to cause the falling and rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be spoken against, ³⁵ so that the thoughts of many hearts will be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."
- Mary Niebuhr *Narrator*: ³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna, the daughter of Penuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old; she had lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ and then was a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshiped night and day, fasting and praying. ³⁸ Coming up to them at that very moment, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem. Luke 2:25-38

Narrator and Congregation: Precious is the Child, because he is our gift of joy.

Part 5: Precious is the Child, because he is our gift to SHARE

Sarah Black *Narrator*: Sometimes both children and adults tend to be selfish with gifts; we don't want to share our toys or possessions with others. Yet some gifts are meant to be shared, especially the gift of God's Son. Jesus didn't come just for our town or church, but for everyone. When we tell other people about the Savior, we don't lose him ourselves. Rather we are enriched even more. After Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, when Herod was king, Wise Men from the east came to Jerusalem.

They asked, ²"Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

³When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. ⁴When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. ⁵"In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

Mia Johnson *Narrator*: ⁶" 'But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for out of you will come a ruler who will shepherd my people Israel.'"

⁷Then Herod called the Magi secretly and found out from them the exact time the star had appeared. ⁸He sent them to Bethlehem and said, "Go and search carefully for the child. As soon as you find him, report to me, so that I too may go and worship him."

⁹After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. ¹⁰When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. ¹¹On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. ¹²And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.

Narrator and Congregation: Precious is the Child, because he is our gift to share.


